

Manage a Multi-Generational Business

For the first time in modern history, four generations — Traditionalists, Baby Boomers, Generation X, and Millennials — are working side by side and presenting new challenges for managers and their employees in the workplace. A definite lack of awareness exists among these four distinct generations. Typically, those of each generation feel they know best, better than those who came earlier, and certainly much better than the new kids on the block. This leads to management challenges and productivity issues.
