Nothing Spooky About October Home Sales

HAR will release **October 2019** MLS statistics this Wednesday. Here is an early peek at some of the key take-aways of our latest Market Update:

Continued low interest rates kept consumers in a buying mood in October, enabling Houston-area home sales to register a fourth consecutive positive month. Sales of single-family homes totaled 7,231. That is up 8.1 percent year-over-year. On a year-to-date basis, sales are 4.2 percent ahead of 2018's record volume, making it ever more likely that 2019 will establish a new record for Houston real estate.

- Single-family home prices set new October highs. The median price increased 2.1 percent to \$240,000, and the average price edged up 1.3 percent to \$298,354.
- Inventory grew slightly again, reaching a 4.0-months supply versus 3.9 a year earlier. NAR reports that the national housing inventory stands at a 4.1-months supply.
- Townhome and condominium sales declined 3.2 percent yearover-year, continuing its roller coaster year of sales.
- Lease properties had a mixed performance in October. Single-family home leases rose 2.4 percent while leases of townhomes and condominiums fell 15.2 percent.

The Next Big Worry for Millennial Consumers



- HAR has shared a lot of information over the past couple of years about the concerns Millennials have with the home buying process.
- But now, a new survey reveals that about half of Millennial homeowners are worrying about how to pay for their children's college education.
- Home equity site **Hometap** surveyed 675 homeowners, including Millennials, for its 2019 *Homeownership Study*.
- Of those surveyed, 73 percent reported feeling "house rich, cash poor" at least some of the time, thanks to the rising costs of homeownership.
- Fifty-nine percent of "well-off" Millennials say they'd delay saving for retirement in order to cover their children's higher education.
