


Weekly Activity Snapshot

New Listings

New listings are tracking slightly above 2022 levels. During the second week of March, REAL-TORS® entered 2,883 properties into the Multiple Listing Service (MLS) compared to 2,696 last year. That is up 6.9 percent.

Pre-Pandemic: New listings are 10.7 percent behind the same week in 2019 when REALTORS® entered 3,229 properties into the MLS.





Pending Listings

Pending listings continue to trail 2022 levels. A total of 2,509 property listings went under contract during Week 10 compared to 2,873 during that same week in 2022. That is down 12.7 percent.

Pre-Pandemic: Pending listings were up 5.5 percent versus the same week in 2019 when 2,378 property listings went under contract.







Off-Market Listings

Sellers withdrew more property listings from the MLS during the week ending March 13 than last year. Off-market listings were up 51.2 percent with a total of 1,048 homes going from active to off-market versus 693 last year.

Pre-Pandemic: Sellers withdrew 8.5 percent fewer listings from the MLS during Week 10 of 2019 when 1,145 homes went off-market.








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Closings

Single-family home closings remained behind 2022 levels in the second week of March. A total of 1,664 units sold versus 2,002 a year earlier. That is down 16.9 percent and marks ten consecutive weeks of declining sales. Pre-Pandemic: Closings were up 4.1 percent compared to the same week in 2019 when a total of 1,599 units sold.







Showings

Property showings performed slightly ahead of 2022 levels during Week 10. Consumer traffic was up 2.4 percent with 44,214 showings compared to 43,162 for the same week last year. Pre-Pandemic: Property showings are up 12.1 percent compared to Week 10 of 2019 when showings totaled 39,426.
