


Weekly Activity Snapshot

New Listings

New listings continued to lag behind 2022 levels. During the week ending June 19, REALTORS® entered 3,103 properties into the Multiple Listing Service (MLS) compared to 3,633 in the same week last year. That is a decline of 14.6 percent.

Pre-Pandemic: New listings are 15.0 percent behind Week 24 of 2019 when REALTORS® entered 3,650 properties into the MLS.




Pending Listings

Pending listings declined 11.3 percent during Week 24. A total of 2,297 property listings went under contract compared to 2,589 in Week 24 of 2022.

Pre-Pandemic: Pending listings were down 7.6 percent when compared to the same week in 2019 when 2,485 property listings went under contract.







Off-Market Listings

Sellers withdrew more property listings from the MLS during the week ending June 19. Off-market listings were 18.6 percent above where they were last year at this time. A total of 1,186 homes went from active to off-market compared to 1,000 last year.

Pre-Pandemic: Sellers withdrew 22.3 percent fewer listings from the MLS during the same time in 2019 when 1,527 homes went off-market.

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
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
Closings

Single-family home closings decreased during Week 24. On a year-over-year basis, closed sales of homes were down 11.3 percent with closed sales totaling 1,829 versus 2,062 last year.

Pre-Pandemic: Closings were up 4.9 percent compared to Week 24 of 2019 when 1.743 units were sold.


Showings

Consumer traffic at property showings throughout the greater Houston area continues to be ahead of 2022 levels. Year-over-year attendance at Houston-area showings was up 16.1 percent for the week ending June 19. Showings volume totaled 44,031 compared to 37,931 for the same time last year.

Pre-Pandemic: Property showings are down 1.9 percent compared to the same week in 2019 when property showings totaled 44,898.
